If we confess our sins, he who is faithful and just will forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. 1 John 1:9

Every Sunday our worship begins with an invocation (In the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit), which is immediately followed by the Brief Order for Confession and Forgiveness. Thus, we begin our worship gathered together by the Holy Spirit, unburdened from our sins, and in the grace and forgiveness of God. With a few exceptions, this has been the basic pattern for Lutheran liturgy for centuries.

Yet, while confessing our sins to God and seeking forgiveness is a biblically rooted means of grace, the Rite of Confession has a somewhat complex history in the Lutheran Church. Many of the abuses which the early Reformers sought to correct were directly associated with the Confessional. In fact, this is one of the central issues that Luther addressed in his 95 Theses, as you can see in the first two:

1. Our Lord and Master Jesus Christ, when He said [Repent] willed that the whole life of believers should be repentance. 2. This word cannot be understood to mean sacramental penance, i.e., confession and satisfaction, which is administered by the priests.

In 1517, when Luther wrote those words, the grace of God was seen as a commodity which could be sold, with exclusive distribution rights given to the church. In that system, confession was less about repenting from sin, but about one's ability to pay. Rather than a source of hope and the assurance of God's eternal love, confession was source of fear and anxiety in rather

Luther did not seek to eliminate confession: he also understood both the psychology as well as the

biblical basis behind repenting one's sins, and hearing the promise of forgiveness. His criticisms and subsequent reforms proclaimed that grace was not something you could earn, let alone purchase.

As the Apostle Paul says in Ephesians 2:8, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God." In many versions of the Small Catechism, Luther's explanation of confession was given its own chapter (often labeled "The Office of the Keys") or in some cases omitted entirely. But in the translation you'll find in the ELW Hymnal, it's part of the chapter on Baptism.

This is reflected in the liturgy as well, as you'll find both private and corporate Confessions in the Baptism section of the services. Theologically, we understand that the Rite of Confession is rooted in the promises of baptism: "all sins and evil desires [are] drowned and die through daily sorrow for sin and through repentance... daily a new person is to come forth and rise up to live before God in right-eousness and purity forever."

In the next few months we'll look at Luther's explanation of confession from the Small Catechism.

SCHOOL KITS

Education is important for any community, especially where poverty or disaster has limited the options for young people to reach their potential. School Kits contain essential supplies to help children—and in some cases, adults—continue learning despite the hardships they face. And that learning leads to a better life for them, their families and their communities.

Include the following items in each School Kit:

- Four 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or collegeruled paper approximately
 8" X 10½"; no loose-leaf paper
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag approximately 14" X 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)

Council Highlights –June, 2017

- Pastor had an unusually large number of meetings to attend the past month, including newly-formed Constitution Revision Committee.
- Pastor Matthew and Immanuel-Trinity pastors are providing on-call pastoral care for Ascension while Pastor Jeff Blain is on sabbatical this summer.
- The Finance Committee has reorganized; members are Chair Mary Arthur, Pastor Matt, Lorri Heimbach, Linda Lepien, Rich Radke, and Treasurer Marcia Snyder.
- If the congregation approves of the drainage improvements project (storm sewer and parking lot),

- Council directed that a general stewardship campaign be combined with a Capital Funds appeal between September and November, to be coordinated by Finance and Stewardship Committees.
- Property Committee met with representatives from Baumhardt Construction and Finance Committee to discuss details of improvements project and proposed financing.
- Property is preparing a letter and supporting data to be mailed out and presented at three informational meetings.
- Special Congregational Meeting to be held after worship on August 6, 2017 to vote on the improvements project.
- Planning/Executive Committee has defined its purposes as (1) helping Pastor Matt plan and coordinate items that don't fit into current committee structure, and (2) to prepare for monthly council meetings.
- Stewardship Committee met on May 18 and June 15, and is working on proposed Capital Campaign and an annual Fall stewardship drive.
- Stewardship Committee also sees need for emphasis on outreach and ministries beyond our parish, along with time and talents commitments.
- Ecumenical Hymn Festival to celebrate the 500 year anniversary of the Reformation will be at former St. Pat's church on Oct. 22 at 3 p.m. We are one of several congregations/choirs participating.
- Pastor has proposed a German mass and German dinner to celebrate the Reformation on All Saints Sunday, Nov. 5.
- Pet blessing service will be offered on August 13.
- Local ELCA congregations are co-hosting a children's choir from Uganda on August 13.
- Thanks to John Talaska, Rich and Janet Radke for painting the music office.
- Jackie Whitenack volunteered to investigate what is needed to regenerate youth ministry.
- Planning Committee recommends organizing an Evangelism Committee geared to three age groups: 50 and over, middle-agers (ages 35 to 50) and young adults (ages 20 to 35). Potential members identified; volunteers are welcome!
- Although Council normally takes a recess in July, because of the special congregational meeting, Council will meet on July 24, 2017 immediately after informational meeting.


