I don't know anything about producing good grapes but enjoy the fruit of the vine.

In this week's gospel, John 15:1-8, we read that Jesus said, "I am the true vine." In Jesus' day, the relationship of the vinedresser and the vine, and how the vineyard worked would be familiar to the people. Jesus uses this metaphor to explain about the kingdom of God and how God's system works in this world by relating it to the vineyard's system.

The vine is the permanent, wooden part of the plant that remains in the trellis. Jesus says that's the part He is, the permanent part. He says that His Father is the vinedresser, owner, caretaker. God owns the land, sustains the vine, prunes its branches, and reaps the rewards of the harvest. The branches are the annual, green leafy stem that grows from the vine. The branches only exist for one season, their lifetime.

During our lifetimes, connected to Jesus, we are the branches that God uses to produce fruit in this world. We are to generate the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control (Galatians 5:22-23). We create the product of the harvest for God our Father, the vinedresser.

No matter who we are, young or old, if we are connected to Jesus, the true vine, He provides all we need to live a life to God's glory and honor. As branches, we take our nourishment and direction from Him for the purpose of a harvest for God's kingdom.

As branches, may we trust in Jesus for everything and may His Spirit flow through us to produce fruit and a rich harvest for God's kingdom.

Lutheran World Relief -- Baby Care Kits

Baby Care kits are our focus in May and June. A new baby is a blessing. Bringing a baby into the world can also be a difficult and scary thing for a mother living in poverty. Keeping a new baby healthy, clean and comfortable can take a lot of resources. Lutheran World Relief Baby Care Kits provide the basics a family needs to care for their newest members and introduce them to the world with pride.

The items needed in each kit include: 2 cotton tshirts. 2 gowns or sleepers, 2 receiving blankets, 4 cloth diapers, 1 jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood or include a baby cap, 2 pairs of



socks, 1 hand towel, 2 bars of soap in original wrapping and 2 diaper pins or large safety pins. The collection basket is on the table by the elevator upstairs.

Have you ever had an old car, one that didn't run very well? One that would often stall in the most inopportune places? You often wondered when leaving home, if you would get to your destination. So once again, wash your hands, fold them, bow your head, and pray with me... Dear Lord, give us patience when we find ourselves "stuck". Help us to look to You for guidance as we head down the road, because we know you are at the wheel and will keep us safe until we reach our destination. Amen
