

One focus of our scriptures for August is on Jesus, the bread of life; the living bread for the life of the world.

Jesus said, "Very truly I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day." (John 6:53-54 NIV)

The Lord's Supper is a sacrament, i.e., a sacred mystery, ordained by Christ as a means of divine grace.

The following was written about the mystery of the Lord's Supper by Martin Luther in the Large Catechism: "It is the true body and blood of the Lord Christ in and under the bread and wine which we Christians are commanded by Christ's word to eat and drink... The sacrament is bread and wine, but not mere bread or wine such as is served at the table. It is bread and wine comprehended in God's Word and connected with it... The Word distinguishes it from mere bread and wine and constitutes a sacrament. We take the bread and wine with Christ's words: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you. Take and drink. Drink of it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this in remembrance of me."

Luther wrote that when we believe what the words say and what they give, we receive the power and benefit of the bread and wine. Our faith is renewed, and we are strengthened for the struggles before us. He made clear that the sacrament does not depend on our worthiness, but on Jesus' promise.

We have a commandment to participate and a promise of eternal life. Thanks be to God!

OF THE CONGREGATION WILL BE HELD

The purpose of the meeting will be to authorize borrowing up to \$75,000 to contract with Security-Luebke Roofing, Inc. of Appleton for the following work:

- Replace all roof sections on the education and elevator wings of the church, at a base cost of \$59,899.00. The FiberTite material that will be used has a 20-yr. warranty and a life expectancy of 35 years or more.
- Replace the current skylight with new, weather-proof commercial skylight inserts that can be fitted into the existing skylight structure. (This option is preferred over a slightly less-expensive option of capping the skylight and losing the natural light in the hallway.)
- Repair and replace a section of roof on the southwest corner of the sanctuary (near the old stairwell to the balcony) which has been subject to water retention and leakage due to previously-existing structural issues.

RATIONALE: Upon receiving Council approval to pursue the project, the Property Committee and three Council members met with a Security Roofing representative on Monday, July 19. After hearing and reviewing his proposal, they voted unanimously to recommend this project to the congregation.

Another proposal from a different company was over \$100,000. If the work is delayed even one more year we can expect the same work by any contractor will be significantly more costly.

It should also be noted that our current debt is lower than it ever has been since the major renovation project in 2001, and interest rates for borrowing remain very favorable.
