"O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will declare your praise." Psalm 51:15

Are you good at prayer? Do you wish that you were better at praying? Do you ever wonder what you should pray for, or how to pray?

For many people, prayer is second nature. For others, including me, prayer is more difficult, something that doesn't come as naturally as we'd like. But over the years, I have learned that like many skills, prayer is something you can develop through regular practice. And while we get a good prayer workout on Sundays, what about the rest of the week? What would it be like to practice multiple times every day?

Historically the church has had a template for daily prayer called the Liturgy of the Hours, or the Daily Office. This is a series of eight prayer services held over the course of a single day (and no, that doesn't include daily Mass!). Typically, you would begin your day with a service called Matins before sunrise (around 3 a.m.) and conclude with Compline before bed (about 8 p.m.).

This is actually still part of our Lutheran tradition. Of course, because there aren't many occupations that allow a person to pause every few hours for a church service, our current hymnal includes only three daily prayer settings—morning, evening, and night.

The concluding prayer for the morning service is actually taken directly from Luther's Small Catechism. Remember, Luther wrote his catechism with the expectation that it would be a teaching tool for parents, a way to practice daily prayer at home. Let's look at Luther's morning prayer: I give thanks to you, heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ your dear Son, that you have protected me through the night from all harm and danger. I ask that you would also protect me today from sin

and all evil, so that my life and actions may please you. Into your hands I commend myself: my body, my soul, and all that is mine. Let your holy angel be with me, so that the wicked foe may have no power over me. Amen.

This prayer begins with thanksgiving for protection through the night: in other words, with our first thoughts each morning, we give thanks to God for the miracle and the gift of life. Next we ask for God's continued presence during the day, moving beyond physical protection during the night into the challenges of each day: sin, temptation, things that lure us from God. Next, we commend ourselves to God. We surrender all that we are to God, putting our trust in God's will. The prayer concludes by asking God to send holy angels to guard us from the evil foe, and guide us from darkness toward light.

A daily morning prayer prompts us to begin each day at the empty tomb at Easter. We entrust ourselves—all that we are—to the promise of God and the glory of Christ's resurrection.

To paraphrase the old adage: to practice prayer makes us aware of the one who is perfect!

#### **COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS – OCTOBER, 2017**

- Financing for capital campaign and existing debt is proceeding with Mission Investment Fund and process should be completed this month.
- New Church Management System (CMS) software for membership records is installed and up and running.
- Pledges for the Capital Campaign are nearing 90% of goal and fall phase will be underway soon.
- Pastor will coordinate with Property and Finance Committees on allocating designated funds to complete installation of new dishwasher and railings for front steps (needed to meet current codes).
- New signs will be made to help visitors locate church office. Also new signs for main floor restrooms.
- Paul will look into obtaining sturdy shelving to help in organizing storage areas.
- Confirmation classes will begin on Oct. 18.

- 20 people are signed up to attend the Youth Gathering in Houston next summer, including 14 youth and 6 chaperones.
- Reformation Sunday Oct. 29 will include processional and everyone attending will receive a copy of Luther's Small Catechism. Re attire is suggested, and red ribbons provided.
- Caroling at the Lutheran Home with choir and youth will take place on Dec. 6.
- Personnel and Nominating Committees will meet to organize on Oct. 28. Immediate goals are to find nominees for council and other appointments, along with future staffing needs and job descriptions.
- Executive/Planning Committee has reviewed the organizational restructuring plan that was developed when Pastor Matt arrived in 2012. Council will review and update at future meetings.
- Paul Kaestner has been monitoring the waterdamaged walls in the back portion of the sanctuary; hopefully they will dry out enough to repaint before the holidays.
- After discussion Council agreed that fund-raising projects at this time be focused on raising the needed funds to help our youth attend the Houston Youth Gathering.
- Volunteers are being identified who can do set-up and take-down for meetings and other activities, i.e. set up tables, chairs, etc. since we no longer have a full-time custodian to do these chores.
- Boy Scout Troop 792 will be selling Scout popcorn and Christmas wreaths for the final time on Oct. 22.
